Background:

India is home to rich culture and traditions that have traversed over thousands of years, and continue to be relevant to our current and future times. The National Education Policy (NEP)-2020 lays emphasis on an inclusive curriculum wherein traditional knowledge finds an important place, for both teachers and students. The Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) Division of the Ministry of Education and the CSIR-Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (CSIR-TKDL) Unit have joined hands to provide awareness and training on matters related to traditional knowledge in the context of intellectual property rights (IPR) as well as the knowledge holder(s) rights. The initiative here in from the IKS Division and CSIR-TKDL Unit is towards disseminating the value that our traditional knowledge holds towards addressing national aspirations on growth and development, while also laying emphasis on the ethical principles that need to be followed while handling and working with such knowledge.

Objective:

The course on Traditional Knowledge - Intellectual Property & People's Rights offers to equip learners on specific areas of Traditional Knowledge, Intellectual Property Rights as well as People's Rights. It covers topics that include general awareness on the diverse areas of our rich heritage, intellectual property rights such as Patents, Copyrights, Trademarks, Plant Varieties Registration, Geographical Indications, etc. and their applicability in specialized context. India's rich heritage spans both codified and oral knowledge. The latter, i.e., oral traditional knowledge, specifically covers the rights of the concerned knowledge holder(s) to such information and thereby his/her/their livelihood. Thus, ethical principles need to be followed.

The objective of the workshop is to develop one's understanding and enhance academic and professional capabilities in terms of traditional knowledge, IPR and People's Rights. The course covers a definitive area of study comprising a general awareness on the vastness and significance of Indian TK, fundamentals of IPR, nature and types of subject-matter, criteria for protection, term, rights, assignment, remedies and enforcements, and also the ethical guidelines that need to be followed while documenting, handling and working with traditional knowledge.

Specific Requirements / Eligibility:

Participation to the workshop is open to all members of the IKS Community, UG & PG students, Research Scholars, all levels of Faculty Members and independent researchers keen to learn about the subject.

Lectures and discussions will be carried out in English, with use of Hindi, where feasible
