What is Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS)?

About the IKS Division of MoE:

The IKS Division of the Ministry of Education at AICTE was established in October 2020, with a vision to promote interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research on all aspects of IKS, preserve and disseminate a deeper understanding and appreciation of IKS for further research, and societal applications. Intellectual Discourse: National Seminar on Nikāma Sevā (March 2-3, 2024):


