Course Objectives:

- 1. To learn the Basics of Sanskrit Grammar, study some of the basic sutras Maheswara sutras and the Panii Sutras
- 2. Able to study oneself some of the ancient Indian Texts.

Learning Outcome:

- 1. This course will introduce the structure of the Pāṇiṇnian sūtras and how they are used to represent the grammatical rules.
- 2. It will also help the students to understand the Sanskrit grammar in a more formal manner.
- 3. This will also take the students in a different domain where the analytical skill is applied.

SYLLABUS

Module-1: Basics of Sanskrit (10 hours)

Alphabets: Knowledge about Sanskrit varṇamāla, emphasis on pronunciation of letters and words, Śabdarūpas and Dhāturūpas, Basics of sentence constructions

Module-2: Māheśvarasūtras and Introduction to Paninian grammarian (11 hours)

Introduction to Paninian Grammar: Introduction to the text and the author, Munitrayas and their compositions Māheśvara-sūtras, sūtras in Samjñā prakaraṇam in Laghu/Siddhāntakaumudī

Module-3: Sandhis and Vibhaktis (11 hours)

Sūtras in Sandhi-prakaraṇam, Sūtras obtaining Vibhaktis of a prātipadika ending with a/3

Module-4: Kārakaprakaraṇaṃ (10 hours)

Kārakaprakaraṇaṃ from Siddhāntakaumudī. The *sūtras* pertaining to Kartṛkāraka, Karaṇakāraka, Sampradānakāraka, Apādānakāraka and Adhikaraṇakāraka. The relation/s between the kārakas and Vibhaktis in the context of sentence (Vākya) construction.
